For over 30 years, Mr. Kelley has litigated at both the trial and appellate levels. Mr. Kelley also serves as pro bono counsel to Christ Episcopal Church in Sag Harbor in the sale of land to be used as a "pocket park" by the Village of Sag Harbor through the expenditure of community preservation funds by the Town of East Hampton.
